November and pleasant weather and at 5 p.m.  
spoke the ship Chelsea of Newland  
found a round cape house & Captain  
Davis master at 6 p.m. our captain  
went on board and got  
some oranges and other fruit and so  
remains this 24 hours

Today that is all of this 24 hours fresh gales  
 November and pleasant weather and at 5 pm  
 we spoke the Chesapeake of New London  
 and the captain came on board  
 but did not stay and at 6 am  
 saw a ship sail a stern of and
