Remarks on Saturday December the 13th
First part fresh gales from the N
Middle and latter part strong winds
and hail squalls tacked ship seven
times 1 S W by W 2 S W 3 S W 4 S W
Made and shortened sail occasionally was
in company with the Canton so ends with
a heavy sea and hail squall.

Lat 57° 16' Long 81° 14'
Remarks on Sunday December the 14th
First part strong winds and squally at 6 pm
tacked ship and stood to the S W by W and latter
part light fresh from the S E Course steered by
Compass S W by W saw some whales was in com-
pany with the Canton so ends

Lat 57° 10' Long 82° 47'
Remarks on Monday December the 15th
First part Calm saw a great many whales
Middle and latter light winds from
the S W was in company with the
Canton so ends

Lat 56° 43' Long 82° 40'
Remarks on Tuesday December the 16th
First and middle part calms the latter
part fresh gales from the S W was in
company with the Canton saw phin
backs so ends

Lat 57° 04' Long 80° 30'

Capt by Philip Bennet on board
Remarks on Wednesday December the 17th
First and middle part Calms and light winds
latter part fresh gales from the S E tacked
ship 3 times the first part Course by Compass
S W by W was in company with the Canton
saw phin backs and so ends

Lat 56° 46' Long 84° 04'
Remarks on Thursday December the 18th
First and middle
part light winds and Calm weather tacked ship at 11 am
at 2 am tacked ship to the S W by W to S E blew a fresh
gale was in company with the Canton saw phin
backs and so ends

Lat 55° 06' Long 84° 10'
Remarks on Friday December the 19th
First part light winds the middle and latter part Calms
from the S W at 3 pm made a round to the S W
in company with the Canton at 10 am sent
down the main top galant mast and repaired
the sail so ends

Lat 55° 45' Long 84° 26'
Remarks on Saturday December the 20th
First part light winds from the N with pleasant
weather at 2 pm Captain Gardner came on board
and spent the afternoon at 7 pm he returned on board
of his ship again at 2 pm sent up the main top
galant mast and yard at 9 pm the wind blew fresh
from the S W so ends

Lat 54° 54' Long 85° 29'
Remarks on Sunday December the 21st
First part light winds from the S the middle and
latter part strong gale and pleasant weather at 4 am
sent up the fore and main top galant masts
saw some whales and porpoises seen by of birds
was in company with the Canton Course by Compass S W
so ends

Lat 55° 39' Long 86° 52'
