This 24 hours light Winds and some rain
Nothing seen remarkable so ends
lat 26° 30' N

Remarks on Monday May the 4 Day
This 24 hours fresh gales and squally
Weather the Watch employed at various
jobs so ends
lat 28° 38' N

Remarks on Tuesday May the 5 Day
This 24 hours light Winds and Calms
the Watch was employed in various jobs
Saw nothing but some birds so ends
lat 29° 07' N

Remarks on Wednesday May the 6 Day
This 24 hours fresh and pleasant Weather
Saw nothing remarkable so ends
lat 29° 07' N

Remarks on Thursday May the 7 Day
This 24 hours fresh gales and plenty of rain
Have begun to take in sail night and morn
In the morning nothing to be seen so ends
lat 22° 16' N Long 178° 3'

Remarks on Friday May the 8 Day
This 24 hours fresh gales from the Southward
Made and shortened sail night and
Morning saw nothing remarkable
The Watch was employed at various jobs
Saw a swimming Whale so ends
lat 22° 16' N

Remarks on Saturday May the 9 Day
This 24 hours light Winds and Calms
Nothing remarkable the Watch was employed
In mending sails and other jobs so ends
lat 23° 52' N

Remarks on Sunday May the 10 Day
This 24 hours light Winds and Calms saw nothing
But small fish so ends
lat 23° 52' N
