Sail every night and morning the Watch was employed at
making Cordage and other jobs so Ends
lat 33.09 N

Remarks on Thursday June the 4 day This 24 hours
light Wind and Calms at 4 a.m. Sough some blackfish
Made and shortened Sail occasionally so Ends

Remarks on Friday June the 5 day This 24 hours
Strong breezes and foggy Weather Sough Nothing made
and shortened Sail occasionally so Ends

Remarks on Saturday June the 6 day This 24 hours
Light Wind and foggy and Rainy Sough nothing
But birds made and shortened Sail so Ends

Remarks on Sunday June the 7 day This 24 hours
fresh gales and pleasant Weather at Sunrise Sough
to Ship to the Windward Sough Nothing but small
fish made and shortened Sail occasionally so Ends
lat 32.10 N

pleasant Weather lost sight of the Eagle Sough nothing remarkable
Made and shortened Sail occasionally so Ends
lat 31.50 N long 167.50 W

Remarks on Wednesday June the 10 day This 24 hours fresh gales and pleasant
Weather at 2 p.m. Sough a school of Whales leaved the boats
but returned With out success so Ends
lat 31.09 N long 168 W

Remarks on Thursday June the 11 day This 24 hours fresh gales
and pleasant Sough porpoises and blackfish made and
shortened Sail occasionally so Ends
lat 30.64 N

Remarks on Friday June the 12 day This 24 hours light
the first part the Weather and latter fresh gales and pleasant
the Ship Eagle about 10 a.m. leaved the boats and
the Watch boat got one Whale so Ends lat 30 N long 169 W

Remarks on Saturday June the 13 day This 24 hours
pleasant Weather Sough plenty of Whales but in the
evening and at 8 p.m. began to hail the Gale but got
stronger and they were a going to the Northward and
Westward very quick so Ends lat 30.01 N long 169.30 W

Remarks on Sunday June the 14 day This 24 hours fresh
gales and pleasant Weather at 6 p.m. got some a-bailing
and cleared up did not see any more Whales but
at 7 p.m. Spoke the ship Ocean of Nantucket
6 months out With 90 lbs of oil Cp & Conphie
Went on board and got some letters so Ends
lat 30 N long 169.30 W
