light winds and pleasant weather at 4 p.m. lowered
the boats for a large Whale and at 5 p.m. the
Waste boat got him and at sunset got him
a long side and at 4 a.m. began to cut him
in. We had had luck the head tone off and he
dunk down but we got him up and at meridian
got the body cut in 50 fms.

gales and pleasant the first part the latter rainier
We started in the Whales ~~boat~~ and I hauled the
Case and at 6 p.m. began to boil ~~Boiled~~ at 11 a.m.
We saw a rather large Whale lowered the boats
and it came up foggy and we lost the view
of him and then returned on board so ends

fresh gales and pleasant and latter rainier at 11 a.m.
got them boiling so ends

fine gales and pleasant caught some porpoises at
6 a.m. began to stow down oil so ends

a Stowing down at 6 p.m. and Calmed up the decks
the Whale made up 4 hundred lbs so ends

light winds and calm caught nothing but birds and
porpoises so ends

Winds and Calm at 5 a.m. lowered the boats for a school
of Whales and chased till meridian then the Steward
boat got a Small Whale so ends Lat 30° N Long 169° West

Remarks on Monday June the 22nd Day this 24 hours light
winds and pleasant took the Whale a long side and at 4
p.m. began to cut him in and got done at 6 p.m. and
at 4 began to boil caught a plenty Whales so ends

Lat 30° 40' N Long 168° 30'

Remarks on Tuesday June the 23rd Day this 24 hours light
winds and pleasant weather caught a plenty of Whales
at sunset and got done a boiling so ends

Lat 31° 01' N Long

Remarks on Wednesday June 24th Day this 24 hours fresh gales
and pleasant weather caught nothing but birds and
porpoises and small fish made and shortened sail every
night and morning so ends

Lat 30° 41' N Long

Remarks on Thursday June 25th Day this 24 hours fresh gales
with some squalls at 5 a.m. reefed the top sails
the Watch was employed in mending sails caught
nothing but birds and small fish so ends

Remarks on Friday June 26th Day this 24 hours fresh gales and
pleasant weather caught nothing Remarkable the Watch
was employed at mending sails and other various
jobs caught nothing but birds so ends
