 Remarks on Tuesday August 6th This 24 hours Strong gales
 from the E with plenty of rain Sailed nothing
 Remarkable about and shortened sail occasionally
 So ends Lat 30° 49'

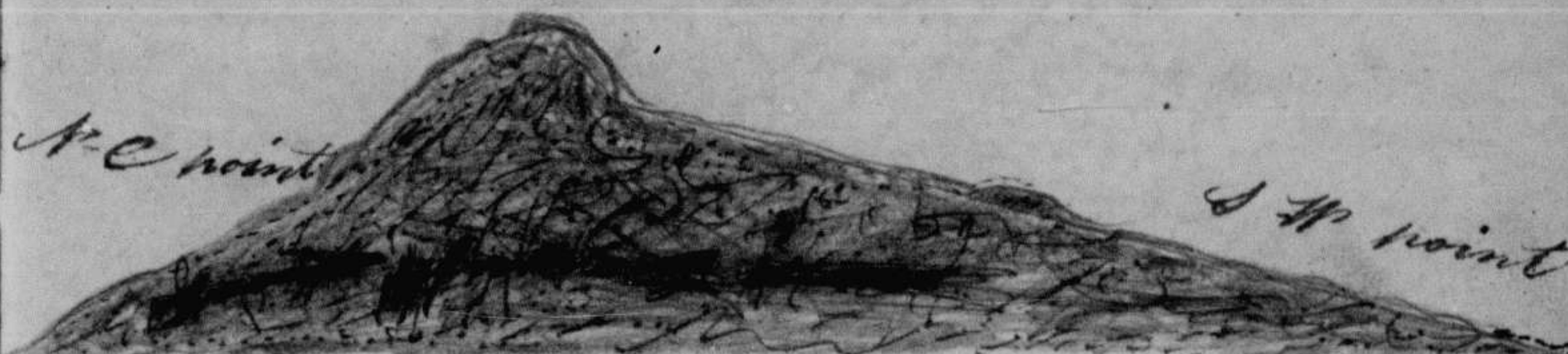
Remarks on Wednesday August 7th This 24 hours
 fresh gales from the E with plenty of rain Sailed
 nothing remarkable took in the forenoon in
 fore sail at sunset and at Sun rise set them
 Again squalls still continued so ends lat 30° 47'

Remarks on Thursday August 8th This 24 hours Strong
 gales from the E & E with a plenty of rain Sent down
 the main sail and began to shorten it. Shook the reefs
 out of the fore sail and set the main top gale
 sail but the squalls continued and we had to
 reef again the watch was in play at midnight
 the main sail so ends lat 32° 03' N long 157° 14' W

Remarks on Friday August 9th This 24 hours
 Strong breezes from the E and some squalls
 of rain At 5 p.m. spoke the ship Winslow
 Thirteen Months out with 13 hundred lbs of oil
 At 6 p.m. we hoisted the boats for a large whale
 But had to return without success so ends lat 33° 27' N

October 12th in the year 1828 from this time
 the view of the island of saint anthony
 at the distance of 10 miles west of
 it a philip Bonnet was on board of
 the ship Richmond when taken
 and from it I named mine as follows
