

I Journal of a voyage in the Ship Richmond in the South Sea
Remarks on Sunday August 23rd This 24 hours light breezes from
the S at 9 am caught a large Whale that in company
with the Winslow lured this boat at meridian and
chased the whale and caught it at 3 sails off the
bow so ends lat 33° 00' N long 168° 18' West

Remarks on Monday August 24th This 24 hours
light winds and calm at 6 pm caught porpoises
at 7 pm caught a sail off the bow beam at 8 am caught
three sails off the bow caught at 10 am caught a large whale
lured and the Winslow got him so ends
lat 33° 00' N long 168° 05' West

Remarks on Tuesday August 25th This 24 hours light
winds and calm at 6 pm took a large whale along
side of the Winslow at 6 am caught a number
of large whales lured and the Winslow's boat got
one large whale and the Shantoon boat got one large
whale caught a plenty of blackfish caught a sail
to the bow so ends a boiling
lat 32° 45' N long 167° 45' W

Remarks on Wednesday August 26th This 24 hours
at 2 pm took a large whale along side of the
Richmond and began to cut at 6 got the head
off and began to boil at 7 am began to cut at 10 am
got the whale in caught 3 sails all then there a
boiling so ends lat 32° 45' N long 167° 25' W

Remarks on Thursday August 27th This 24 hours
light winds from the SW all hands in blazes
in boiling until 4 am then caught a number
of large whales lured and the barboard boat
struck and the line parted the Winslow's boat
got another and took him along side of the
Richmond caught a sail to the windward a boiling
so ends lat 32° 00' N long 168° 00' West

Remarks on Friday August 28th
This 24 hours pleasant weather at 1 pm took the
whale along side of the Richmond at 2 began
to cut at 6 got the whale in the Winslow took the
head at 7 pm began to boil at 7 am caught a large
whale lured to the SW narrow quick did not leave
caught a sail and so ends lat 32° 40' N long 165° West

Remarks on August 29th This 24 hours light
winds and calm at 3 pm took a large whale
along side of the Winslow and took the head
at long side of the Richmond at 6 am caught
a number of large whales lured and the Wins
low's boat got a large whale and the Starboard
boat got one caught a plenty of blackfish
caught a sail to leeward a boiling
so ends lat 32° 45' N long 167° 45' W

Remarks on Sunday August 30th
This 24 hours fresh gales and squally all hands
employed at stowing oil winds from the S E
the lying under a double reefed top sail and
fore sail so ends lat 32° 33' N

Remarks on Monday August 31st
This 24 hours fresh gales from the S E & caught some
porpoises at 4 am the Winslow caught a large whale
but she went down and did not see her again
the mast and shortened sail occasionally
so ends lat 32° 14' N
