Remarks on Thursday January the 14 this 24  
hours fresh breezes from the ESE and pleasant  
Weather the Watch Masina ploughed in fitting Ship  
Saw nothing but phin backs and small  
fish made and shortened Sail Night and morning  
So Ends lat 38 miles S long 104.30 West

Remarks on Friday January the 15 this 24  
hours pleasant breezes from the SE Course Steered  
Saw Bumpas When free was W and the Watch  
Mas employed in Ship's duty Sough  
A Ship Standing to the SE on the third day  
Sails 4 Seags So Ends lat 110 S long 104.30 West

Remarks on Saturday January the 16 this 24  
Hours Strong breezes from the E but some  
Variable Sough plenty blackfish porpoises and  
Phindacks Wind to the SE and made and shortened  
Sail Occasionally So Ends lat 35 miles South long

Remarks on Sunday January the 17 this 24 hours  
Fresh breezes from the E and ESE and pleasant  
Weather Course Steered When free W and on the third  
SSE Sough nothing Made and shortened Sail  
Occasionally So Ends lat 3.11 Long

Remarks on Monday January the 18 this 24  
Hours fresh breezes and pleasant Weather Sough phin  
Backs and porpoises but there is no line of any  
Sperm Whales yet We are 100 and 16 days without seeing  
The report of one with 5 men to the mast heads  
at once So Ends lat 3.32 South long no Whales

Remarks on Tuesday January the 19 this 24 hours fresh  
gales With some rain layed With the head yards a bath  
from Sun till Sun Course Steered by Compass S W  
Sough nothing but Tumpers and phin backs and porpoises  
to in and Made sail occasionally So Ends lat 4.32 long 112.30

Remarks on Wednesday January the 20 this 24 hours fresh  
Breezes from the E Sough some porpoises but no sperm  
Whales and So Ends lat 4.40 S long

Remarks on Thursday January the 21 this 24 hours fresh  
gales from the S and pleasant Weather the Watch at  
Work on various jobs Sough plenty porpoises and  
blackfish and algerous Made and shortened Sail occasion  
ally Course W and S W So Ends lat 10.36 South

Remarks on Friday January the 22 this 24 hours fresh  
Breezes from the South Course Steered S first part the  
middle S W latter part South West Winds SE at  
2.00 m Sough school of Whales loosed and the Watch  
boat struck a calf and the Starboard boat struck  
A large Whale and took him a long side of  
Mexico So Ends lat 11.00 S long 115 West

Remarks on Saturday January the 23 this 24 hours  
Pleasant breezes from the SE and began to hail  
Cut at 1 p.m. and got done at Sunset and hailed  
the case in the morning and began to hail at  
7 a.m. So Ends lat 46 miles S long 114.30 West

Remarks on Sunday January 24 this 24 hours pleasant  
Weather the Watch Mas employed in boiling Sough  
some Tumpers and porpoises So Ends lat 113 Long

Remarks on Monday January pleasant Weather the Watch  
Mas employed the first part in boiling at 8 p.m. Spoke  
the ship Rose Brusel of Antioch 12 months out  
With 15 hundred barrels of oil and got a hole and at 11 a.m.  
Spoke the Ship Columbus of Valparaiso and was master  
8 months out with 1500 barrels
