employed in various Jobs. So ends lat 30.48 N long 168

Remarks on Saturday June 26 this 24 hours
light winds and pleasant. At 9 pm Spoke the
Ship's course of Nantucket and the Chelsea
Davis of New London 25 Months out with 2000
Mbls of oil. Saw 3 ships to the Windward
So ends lat 30.10 N long 169.00 E

Remarks on Sunday June 27 this 24 hours
light winds and Calm at 4 pm Spoke the Ship
Currell North of Nantucket 26 Months out with
1500 Mbls of oil in Company with the Ocean
Saw Nothing So ends lat

Remarks on Monday June 28 this 24
hours light winds and Calm. Saw the porpoises
and small fish. Was in Company with the Russell
Saw Chelsea. So ends

Remarks on Tuesday June 29 this 24 hours
light winds and pleasant weather. Saw a large
Ship. Saw plenty of plankton and porpoises.
So ends lat 30.10 N long 168 E

Remarks on Wednesday June 30 this 24 hours
pleasant weather at 1 pm hoisted and got
Navy of whale at 4 pm hoisted and got 3
Whales. Spoke the Hazard
So ends lat 30.18 N long 168.20 E

at 8 pm got the boiling in and began to
hoil and the latter part cut in the
Others tried a boiling

in the heads got 9 of them have ice
and the cases haled so ends

Remarks on Saturday July 3 this 24 hours
fresh breezes and squally. All
hands employed in boiling and
hoil in the other head. Spoke the
Chelsea. So ends

Remarks on Sunday July 4 this 24
hours fresh breezes and squally
got saw a boiling at a midnight the
latter part employed in hoiling
down. So ends

Remarks on Monday July 5 this 24
hours fresh breezes and plenty of
rain. All hands employed in extracting
down. So ends
