Wednesday July 25th 1799
Came with a Calm attended with light
airs from S. E. & very pleasant heading
E. N. E. employed in washing ship
middle & latter part the same saw many
blackfish lower part of them once Lat 39. 15
Long by Chron 169. 46
Do .. Lunas 169. 53

Thursday July 26th
Came with light breezes from S. E. &
very pleasant steering by E. middle
& latter part the same saw blackfish
Lat by Obs 39. 00
Long 169. 20

Wednesday July 27th
Came with light breezes from South
& very pleasant steering by E. S. E.
middle & latter part fresh breezes from
the S. W. & aft steering S. E. by E. saw one brig
steering S. E. Lat 39. 55 Long 167. 20

Thursday July 28th
Came with strong breezes from N. W.
steering S. by E. by compass middle
& latter part the same & over cast
Lat by Obs 39. 12 Long by Chron 165. 57

Sunday July 29th
Came with fresh breezes from
N. W. & over cast steering E. by compass
middle part squales of rain from N. W.
latter part clear wind N. with a strong
southerly current about 2 miles per
hour Lat by Obs 37. 9 Long by Chron 163. 42

Thursday November 15th 1799
All this 24 hours came in with strong
breezes from the N. W. & steering E. N. E.
by compass with squales of rain Lat 46. 57. 24
Long by Chron 79. 24

Friday Nov 16th
Came with strong breeze from N. W.
pleasant steering E. N. E. At 7 P. M. wind
veered to W. W. steering N. by compass
At 24 A. M. saw Cape Horn latter part
pleasant Lat by Obs 55. 55
Long by Chron 65. 12

Saturday Nov 17th
Came with light breezes from S. W. &
very pleasant At 5 P. M. Calm At 8
P. M. took a light breeze from the
E. N. E. heading E. S. E. New Island dist
220 miles Staten Island 50 miles At 3 A. M.
took to the N. W. At 9 A. M. spoke the
ship Carter of New Bedford 34 months
out 50 Bats of Whale Lat by Obs 55. 5
Long by Chron 65. 14
Del. Keger dist 15 miles

Sunday Nov 18th
Came with strong breezes from E. N. E.
& cloudy working the ship up towards
the Straits of Lamas At 5 P. M. entered
the Straits weather thick & rain the
wind E. steering by N. At 11 P. M. wind veered
to S. E. steering N. E. by compass latter
part blowing strong from S. E. saw a
English Bark Lat by Obs 53. 24
