

Wednesday 11 mo 18 These 24 hours commence with strong Gale from the East and rainy middle part - Squally with rain Thus Ends all well Course S by W

Thursday 11 mo 19 These 24 hours commence with light breezes from ESE and rainy middle part heavy squally took in Top Galt-Sails and reefed Top sails ~~middle~~ part strong breezes took out the reef and set main Top Galt-Sail latter part the same Course S W

Friday 11 mo 20 These 24 hours commence with fresh breeze from the East and pleasant middle part is in the same latter calm but no wind thus ends all well Course S W

Saturday 11 mo 21 These 24 hours commence with strong Gale from the Eastward and pleasant middle & latter part the same All hands engaged at Sunday jobs Thus ends all well Course S W

Sunday 11 mo 22 These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from the East and pleasant middle and latter part the same saw fin back spots Thus Ends all well Course S W 5

Monday 11 mo 23 These 24 hours commenced with strong breezes from the E. and pleasant weather At 5 AM saw sperm whales hove away in pursuit but without success middle and latter part the same Course S W - led by J S Chace

Tuesday 11 mo 24 These four and 20 hours strong breezes from the ESE and clear saw white water middle part the same latter part calm course S west

Wednesday 25 of 11 mo These 24 hours commence with fresh Gale from WSW and squally but open for Top sail & T-Sail set and reefed Stay sail At 3 AM Double reefed Top sails At 6 AM moderate turned out the reef and set T-Galts At 11 AM Double reefed Top sails and furled mainsail latter part moderate all sail set steering by the wind reef to S by E

Thursday 26 of 11 mo commenced with fresh Gale from SSW and heavy weather At 6 AM Double reefed Top sails At 7 AM closed reefed fore and main Top sails furled main sail and jib at 10 AM closed main Top sail middle and latter part blowing heavy from SSW took in the jib Boom at 2 PM

Friday 27 of 11 mo These 24 hours commence with heavy Gale from SSW under closed reefed main Top sail and fore sail middle part the same latter part moderate whole Top sails and M T Galt set

Saturday These 24 hours commence with light breeze from S W and pleasant at 4 AM raised whales lowered away and chased but without success middle part heavy Gale from the S W and pleasant At 7 PM Calmed all hauls and Double reefed Top sails furled the mainsail and set the main stay sail At 10 PM closed reefed Top sails the wind blowing heavy from the S W. Led by John Stiers

Sunday 11 mo 29 These 24 hours commence with moderate Gale shook out the reef fore and main T-Galts middle part strong Gale latter part Double reefed Top sails furled mainsail and set for Topmast and main staysail at 10 AM furled the jib and Macker At 11 AM closed reefed fore and main Top sails Thus ends all well

Monday 11 mo 30 These 24 hours commence with heavy Gale from the Southward middle part the same latter part heavy furled the fore Top sail at 10 PM set the 5 Top sail and took out on deck of the main Topmast during by the wind up S W by South Thus ends all well

Tuesday 12 mo 1st These 24 hours commence with strong Gale from the South West and pleasant tack'd ship middle part more moderate set the mainsail jib & Spanker latter part calm made all sail saw fin back spots during by the wind up to South West by South

Wednesday 12 mo 2 These 24 hours commence with calm and pleasant middle part squally latter part calm caught a porpoise saw fin backs in abundance all day Course S W 4

Thursday 12 mo 3 These 24 hours commence with calm middle part strong breezes latter part calm shift of wind Course S W 4

Friday 12 mo 4 These 24 hours commence with fresh breezes from the N E and pleasant middle part the same latter part cloudy with rain all hauls engaged at looking out after water for Cape Horn 80 Course S W
