Top sails At 2 P.M. furled jib and spanker mainmast
foresail fore Topmast and main Topmast and set
the main stay sail latter part heavy Gales

Saturday 26 of 12 Mo. commence with heavy Gales from
the west and squally weather middle and latter
part heavy Gales The ship lying too under close
masts main Topmast and staysails

Sunday 27 of 12 Mo. commence with heavy Gales
from the west accompanied with squalls of hail
At 4 P.M. set fore and main Topmast and foresail
At 9 P.M. set on up out of the main Top sail to
6 P.M. set the mainmast jib and spanker running by the
wind up to N by E

Monday 28 of 12 Mo. commence with fresh breezes from
the west at 4 A.M. close masts Top sails and furled
mainmast jib and spanker At 5 M. furled fore and
main Top sail At 11 M. set fore Top sail, main
Top sail and set the mainmast jib and spanker
latter part fresh breezes strong N by W

Tuesday 29 of Dec. commence with fresh breezes from
the west and cloudy At 6 A.M. set the upper part
of the Top sails and set the main Top Galt sail
running by the wind up to N.W. to Oct

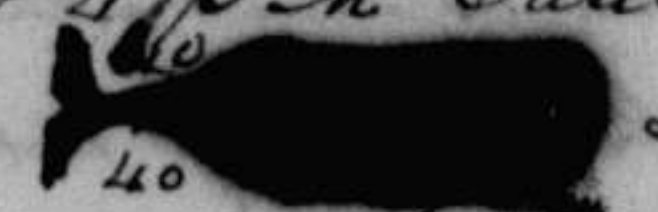
Wednesday 12 Mo 30 These 24 hours commence with strong

Gales from the west and hazy weather middle

Topmast staying sail At 9 P.M. set main Top Galt
my sail latter part the same course N.W. by W
Friday 1 Mo 1. 1850

Commenced with fresh breezes from the west and cloudy
middle part wind west took in the staying sails
at 7 P.M. past a ship steering South course N.W.

Saturday 1 Mo 2 These 24 hours commence with
fresh breezes from the N.W. and cloudy weather

breezes from the west and pleasant weather all
sail set course N by E

Monday 1 Mo 4 These 24 hours commence with

raised whaler hauled away and took on to the Starboard
2d Boat the Starboard fastened and after 5 hours
running hauled At 4 P.M. called all hands and
commenced cutting  S.D. raised by J.T.

breezes from the south the hands engaged at trying at
6 A.M. spoke the Howards of Nantucket at 4 P.M. spoke
the Independence of New Bedford

Wednesday 1 Mo 6 These 24 hours commence with
breezes from the south and pleasant At 6 P.M. fired
a boiling water a Spik and spoke the Splendid
of Edgartown and saw several other sails.

Thursday 1 Mo 7 At the 24 hours light breezes from
the south and pleasant weather at 5 P.M. raised
whaler hauled and took on to the Starboard Boat
at 9 P.M. commenced cutting in
