Saturday 1 Mo 9 All this 24 hours light breeze from the south and pleasant all hands employed at Boiling

~~Sunday~~ 1 Mo 10 This 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze from the south and cloudy At 3 AM finished boiling and washed ship at 7 PM Gamma with the French of New Bedford Capt Briggs

Sunday 1 Mo 11 This 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze from the south and cloudy broke out the hoist and commenced blowing down our sail

Sunday 12 of Jan This 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze from the south and cloudy finished stowing down our sail &c

Monday 13 This 24 hours light breeze from the south and cloudy saw plenty of B Fish

Tuesday 13 of 1 Mo This 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze from the south and cloudy At 9 PM made land Bearing N N West Distance 30 Mo which proved to be Mochy

Wednesday 1 Mo 14 This 24 hours fresh breeze from the south and cloudy At 5 AM spoke and Gamma with the Planter of Nantucket Capt Hunter

Thursday 1 Mo 15 This 24 hours fresh breeze from the south spoke Planter again and sold him some Tobacco

Friday 17 of Mo This 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze and cloudy weather round down the coast wore ship several times spoke the Bark Arab of Scarborough

Saturday 1 Mo 18 This 24 hours commenced with strong Gale from the south and cloudy weather starting by the wind on different Tacks see nothing this day sent down our F R & Top Gale Mast

Sunday 19 of Mo This 24 hours strong Gale from the south and squally At 2 AM made the Isle of Mochy Bearing N Distance 25 miles hauled on the wind short and sail and at 6 PM made sail and kept her off for

Monday 20 This 24 hours fresh breeze from the south and pleasant all sail set hauled the ship on the wind and commenced with heaving up the harbor of Talcahuano at 4 AM came to Anchor in 7 fathoms of water at 6 PM called all hands and warped into the harbor farther found 6 fathoms of American ships The Head of Tahiti the French of New Bedford The Abella of Plymouth The Am. Firm of Plymouth The Telegraph of Sag Harbor the Baltic Nantucket and the Noble Lord Edward

Tuesday 21 This 24 hours of comfort moderate Gale from the south and pleasant lying at anchor in the harbor of Talcahuano all hands employed at repairing ship and warming water and blacking beds

Wednesday 22 of Jan This 24 hours moderate breeze from the south and pleasant the 1 watch on shore Liberty

Thursday 23 of Jan This 24 hours light breeze from the S and clear the 1 watch ashore on Liberty

Friday 24 of Jan This 24 hours light breeze from the south and clear 1 watch on Liberty

Saturday 25 of Jan This 24 hours light breeze from N and foggy the Starboard watch on Liberty

Sunday 26 of Jan This 24 hours light breeze from N and foggy all hands on board blacked the watch beds and set off 20 bushels of Potatoes and &c

Monday 27 of Jan This 24 hours light Gale from N and clear the 1 watch on Liberty took off Potatoes and onions

Tuesday 28 of Jan commenced with light breeze from the south and clear at 8 PM then short at 9 PM got underway and stood out of the harbor later part again the ship lying between Biscan and the main land

Wednesday 29 of Jan This 24 hours light Gale from the S and clear succeeded in getting out of the Bay by 10 PM at sunset shortened sail for the night middle part blowing heavy from the south later more moderate N. E. S. E.
