

Tuesday 28 of June These 24 hours fresh Gales from the S.W. and a pleasant At 5 A.M. saw two sail in the distance. At 11 A.M. lowered the Larboard boat and went a fishing with the Tobacco Plant Swam of New Bedford 22 mi. out 13 or 14 saw the Egg of Bristol 30 mi S.W.

Wednesday 29 of June These 24 hours commencing with fresh Gales from the W.S.W. and pleasant at one P.M. the Barque heeled to the wind to the leeward and made signals for whale at 30 minutes past 1 the L.B. came on board from her fishing excursion and in 20 minutes away and then for the whale At 2 P.M. lowered away our boat to the Tobacco Plant like wise at 4 P.M. the S.B. followed whilst in the act of rounding Mr. Dargell came up hand a his line (for fear the whale would take the whole of them) on the wrong side of the Boat which drew the line injuring it & him a scratch on the back and upset her Mr. Douglas was very badly cut with his second iron on the back part of his thigh near the knee among those large coral which laid him up for some time the latter sailed boats in case of Black and white. I saw day 6 P.M. 30 These 24 hours the Island of Abaco on South West distance 30 miles at sunset suddenly to wind up to N.W.

Thursday 30 of June These 24 hours strong Gales and pleasant commencing by the wind up to W.S.W. saw four boats Saturday 1 mo 2 These 24 hours strong Gales from the S.E. and pleasant At 7 A.M. sailed up to the S.W. Sunday 3 of July Commenced with strong breeze from the S.E. and pleasant. Rather great turned on the out of the Popoils

Monday 7 mo 4 17th 60 year of American Independence Strong Gales from the E.S.E. and pleasant At 6 A.M. squared the yards kept off W.S.W. Lat 3.5 S Long 99 15 W

Tuesday 7 mo 5 These 24 hours fresh Gales from the E.S.E. and Char strong W.S.W. at sunset took out sail and hauled on the wind to the N. At 10 A.M. saw made sail Lat 4.00

Wednesday 7 mo 6 These 24 hours light Gales from the E.S.E. during the at sunset shortened sail

Thursday 7 mo 7 These 24 hours light Gales from the E.S.E. and Char commencing sail Lat 5.26 S Long 104.00 Friday 8 of July These 24 hours light Gales from the E.S.E. and pleasant a sail in sight to the westward a cutter in.

Saturday 7 mo 9 These 24 hours fresh Gales from the E.S.E. and pleasant At 30 min past 2 raised a whale off our bow Dist 2 1/2 miles at 3 P.M. lowered away and chased a small sail whale running to the leeward Lat 4.51 S Long 104 Sunday 7 mo 10 These 24 hours fresh breeze from the E.S.E. and Char At P.M. raised whale off our bow Dist 4 miles lowered away the boat just before sunset saw nothing more of them came on board and shortened sail Lat 4.55 Tuesday 8 of August

Monday 7 mo 11 These 24 hours fresh breeze from the E.S.E. and pleasant a sail in sight Lat 5.50 S Long 104.30

Tuesday 7 mo 12 These 24 hours strong Gales from the E.S.E. and Char one sail in sight after up for bounty

Wednesday 7 mo 13 These 24 hours light Gales from the S.E. and Char Nothing remarkable at 4.49 Long 113.71

Thursday 7 mo 14 These 24 hours strong Gales and pleasant Lat 5.10

Friday 7 mo 15 These 24 hours strong Gales from the E.S.E. and Char At 7 P.M. squared the yards went west by N

Saturday 7 mo 16 These 24 hours strong Gales from the E.S.E. and Char Lat 5.00 South

Sunday 7 mo 17 These 24 hours strong Gales and pleasant Gales N.W.

Monday 18 These 24 hours light breeze from the E.S.E. At 1 P.M. raised a whale off our bow Dist 1 mi and a 1/2 At 2 P.M. lowered away and took on to the S.B. at 4 P.M. took him along side and got ready for cutting at day light commenced

Tuesday 19 These 24 hours fresh breeze E.S.E. and pleasant commenced boiling Long 106.00
