winward cutting in Lat 4.30 South Long 107 00
Thursday 7 Mo 21 These 24 hours light Gale from
the ESE and clear at 5 P.M. finished Baking.

Friday 7 Mo 22 These 24 hours light Gale from ESE
and pleasant Lat 4.28 Long 116.45

Saturday 7 Mo 23 These 24 hours light Gale and clear

Sunday 7 Mo 24 These 24 hours light Gale from the ESE
and pleasant. Lat 4.10 S Long 117.30

Monday 7 Mo 25 These 24 hours strong Gale from ESE
and squally At day light put the mainsail and
commenced making out to slow down on all

Tuesday 7 Mo 26 These 24 hours strong Gale from
the South E and pleasant much a stirring down
at sunset later part blowing off with empty East

Wednesday 7 Mo 27 These 24 hours fresh Gale from
the ESE and cloudy washed ship so so ends
all well Lat 4.16 Long 118.05

Thursday 7 Mo 28 These 24 hours commence with
heavy Gale from the ESE and pleasant at sunset
took in the mainsail so ends all well

Lat 4.40 Long 118.06

Friday 7 Mo 29 These 24 hours strong breeze from ESE and
cloudy weather At 1 P.M. lowered away 1.45. out and took a part of the
ship standing by the wind on both tacks, under double reefed 3rd
jib, main and courses Lat 5.10 Long 118.10

Saturday 7 Mo 30 These 24 hours strong breeze from ESE
and clear later part kept off N.W. Wind E.N.E. all
well

Sunday 7 Mo 31 These 24 hours heavy breeze from
the ESE and clear during W.N.W. the first
that the latter strong W.S.W. Lat 4.30

Monday 8 Mo 1 These 24 hours commenced
with light Gale during W.S.W. later part saw
whales lowered in chase but without success
the whales very shy - the boats came on board
and we got sick. Raised by Hamish Howland
Long 118.17

Tuesday 8 Mo 2 These 24 hours strong Gale
from the ESE the whales still in sight running
fast to the leeward At 1 P.M. lowered away and
chase without success the latter part nothing mark-
able Lat 5.33 Long 118.20

Wednesday 8 Mo 3 These 24 hours strong Gale from
the ESE and clear At 1/2 past 3 P.M. saw whales
lowered and fastened on waist. Port the short way
parted later part saw a fin back appeared all
well Raised by M.B. Lat 5.33 Long 118.16

Thursday 8 Mo 4 These 24 hours strong Breeze
from the ESE and clear mudding sails 4 P.M. later
part the same Lat 5.30 S Long 118.20

Friday 8 Mo 5 These 24 hours commenced with
fresh breeze from the ESE and pleasant mudding
later part the same Lat 4.57 Long 118.16

Saturday 8 Mo 6 These 24 hours commenced with fresh
Gale from ESE and pleasant later part saw a
sail to the windward off our weather Bow
Lat 4.50 Long 118.29

Sunday 8 Mo 7 These 24 hours commenced with strong
Gale from the ESE and pleasant spoke the ship
Abigail Regnard of New Bedford 10 Mo out 350
casks in letters for me very much disappointed
Lat 5.40 Long 118.10

Monday 8 Mo 8 These 24 hours commenced with
strong Gale from the ESE and clear the Abigail
in sight on our weather quarter about 12 miles
off Lat 5.15 Long 119.55

Tuesday 8 Mo 9 These 24 hours commenced with
fresh Gale from the ESE and pleasant spoke the
Abigail strong Gale without our speaker
and spoke the Bangs and Brails but a new one
of E Lat 5.00 Long 119.00

Wednesday 8 Mo 10 These 24 hours commenced
with fresh breeze from the ESE and clear
a ship in sight Lat 4.48 Long 119.30

Thursday 8 Mo 11 These 24 hours commenced with
clear weather and strong Gale spoke the ship
Abigail Regnard of Bedford Lat 4.40 Long 119.30
