from S.E. and cloudy saw a ship to the
windward steering by the wind on
different tack nothing remarkable

Thursday 24th There 24 hours strong breeze
from S.E. and pleasant saw a ship supposed
it to be the same one that we saw yesterday
steering by the wind on different tack
Lat Long

Friday 25th There 24 hours strong breeze from the
S.E. and pleasant saw plenty finn Backs
Blackfish &c steering by the wind on different
tacks nothing more remarkable
Lat Long

Saturday 26th There 24 hours moderate breeze from
S.E. and pleasant weather steering by the wind
on different tacks

Sunday 27th There 24 hours moderate breeze from
S.E. and pleasant saw several finn Backs
and &c steering by the wind on different tack
Lat Long

Monday 28th There 24 hours moderate breeze from S.E.
and pleasant at 9 AM saw whales
lowered away and took two one to the L Boat
and one to the W Boat the L Boat got store
Lat Long

Tuesday 29th There 24 hours moderate breeze
from the S.E. and pleasant took the whales
along side and commenced cutting in succeeded
in getting the body of one in by sunset at
daylight called all hands and finished commenced boiling
Lat Long

Wednesday 11mo 30 1836
There 24 hours moderate breeze from the S.E.
and pleasant all hands employed at boiling at
1 PM raised whale lowered away the two L Boats
the whales creaked by running to the windward
plenty of whales in every direction
Lat Long

Thursday 12mo 1 1836
There 24 light breeze from S.E. and pleasant
employed at boiling plenty of whales still in
sight going to the windward at 5 PM lowered
away the L and W Boat and took one to the
W Boat at 8 AM took him along side at
daylight called all hands and commenced
cutting in at 9 AM finished
Lat Long

Friday 2nd There 24 hours light breeze from S.E.
and pleasant all hands employed at boiling
saw plenty Blackfish steering by the wind on
different tacks
Lat Long

Saturday 3rd There 24 fresh breeze from S.E.
and pleasant at 7 AM finished boiling and
washed off steering by the wind
Lat Long

Sunday 4th There fresh breeze from S.E. and
pleasant saw a sail to the leeward employed
at breaking out and stowing down oil
in the fore hold at 1 PM raised a whale
lowered away all three Boats at 11 AM the
Boats came on board the whale still in sight
running to the windward

Monday 5th There 24 hours fresh breeze
from S.E. and cloudy saw a sail standing
in our wake which proved to be the
Magnolia of New Bedford Capt Howland 26
1700 whales still in sight running to the
at 2 PM lowered away and took one to the W Boat
at sunset took him along side at day
light called all hands and began cutting in
