

Ship Robert Edwards off Shore
Saturday 22 of July 1837

First whales and pleasant at 6 AM saw several Buckles supposed them to be whales At 7 AM saw buckles again ahead at 11 AM saw more buckles which proved to be whales

Latitude 134 S Longy p Obz 108.48
Sunday 23 fine Sails and pleasant weather at 3 PM first Meridian found the boat and got two of them one to the N. and one to the S. at 4 PM took them along side at daylight commenced cutting and finished by 9 AM Latitude 132 Longy 109.33

Monday 24 these 24 hours strong heavy & pleasant saw plenty of Sappho Bottoms employed at boiling Latitude p Obz 1.42 S Longy 109.18

Tuesday 25 these 24 hours moderate seas saw nothing stirring upon a wind at 6 PM finished boiling Latitude 2.57 Longy p Obz 110.18

Wednesday 26 these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant breaking out and blowing around oil Latitude p Obz 3.57 Longy p Obz 110.45

Thursday 27 these 24 hours moderate seas and clear finished stowing oil Latitude p Obz 5.12

Friday 28 these 24 hours best Sails saw nothing Latitude 4.47 Longy p Obz 111.37

Saturday 29 Light breeze and clear weather saw nothing Latitude 4.26 Longy p Obz 111.41

Sunday 30 light breeze & spoke the Mile north of New Bedford 28 miles 2400 (she was then boiling two large whales) reports the loss of the Oregon of Fair Haven at Tahiti on a reef she was run and bound from also the loss of the ship of Nantucket the Meridian of Sagadahoc and an English ship in a gale of wind and not near the particulars the probability is all having perished

Tuesday 1 of 8 mo 1837 these 24 hours light breeze and clear weather spoke the mile again but there have 3 cast of water

Longy p Obz 112.46 West

Wednesday 2 these 24 hours best breeze from the S. S. E. and clear Latitude p Obz 4.29

Longy p Obz 112.49
Thursday 3 stirring upon a wind with some showers Latitude p Obz 5.29 Longy p Obz 113.4

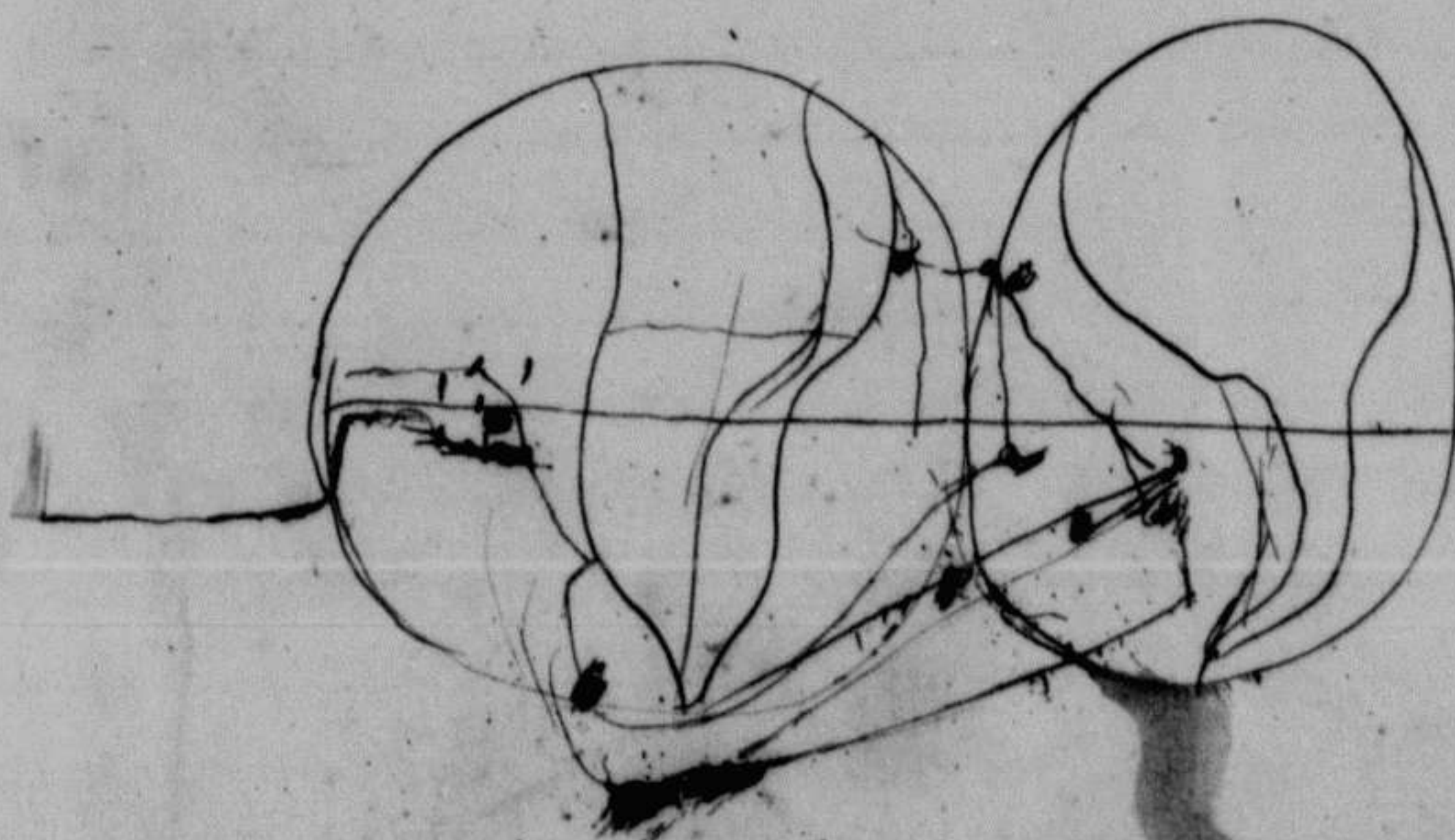
Friday the 4 of August

these 24 hours strong heavy and squally under all sail stirring to Southward sent in the Fly jib Boom to get the rigging etc
