weather and fresh trade from the East & East by North

rigging masting new running rigging &c

Saturday 3 These 24 hours strong breeze from
S by E and on cast steering upon a wind up to
S by W engaged at fitting ship commenced stand-
ing watch Lat 24.17

Sunday 4 Commencing with fresh breeze from the
E S E and pleasant middle part the same steering
by the wind to the South latter part wind from
the East and clear course South At 10 AM set
the Fore Top Mast and ^{studding} Top Gale-studding sails

Monday 5 Commencing with light winds from
the N.E. and pleasant set the lower studding sail
at 6 PM wind came to the Eastward took in the
lower studding sail middle part the same latter
part wind the same weather fine came South

Tuesday 6 These 24 hours commenced with winds
from the East and pleasant course South by East
middle part calm latter part strong winds from
the North studding sails set and beloff.
