Sunday March 25 first part strong wind from the N. N. W. with rain at 6 P. M. wind ceased suddenly to S. by South made part strong Gale from S. W. and frequent heavy squalls of wind and rain latter strong Gale from S. W. and squally strong Ely W. E. N. E. - N. E. Lat. p. 34. 40. Long p. 46. 14

Monday 26 first part fresh wind from S. W. & squally weather made and latter parts mild and weather much the same strong Ely S. found I know not when Lat. p. 33. 57. Long p. 46. 15

Tuesday 27 first part of the 24 hours strong Gale from S. W. and clear weather strong East wind and latter parts much the same strong Ely North Lat. p. 33. 52. Long p. 46. 16

Wednesday 28 commencing with strong Gale from S. by S. and clearing at 6 P. M. took in the N. Boat and then at 5 P. M. Gale sails made part moderate set 5 P. M. Gale sails 2 P. M. Mast standing sail later part set the lower standing sail strong Ely N. the hatch running sails so easy Lat. p. 33. 57 Long 33. 20

Thursday 29 first part strong Gale from the N. S. W. and clear took in the lower standing sail at 6 P. M. took in top mast and top Gale standing sail middle part strong breeze took in fore and M. top Gale sails at 6 P. M. more moderate made an air sail strong N. E. by E. set the standing sails Lat. p. 32. 55. Long p. 46. 16

Friday 30

Saturday 31 commencing with moderate breeze from the S. W. and pleasant weather and latter part much the same covered N. E. by E. Lat. p. 31. 27 Long p. 46. 27. 2

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Thursday 29 of March first part light wind from the West and wind pleasant made and latter part the same strong N. E. by N. - N. E. so easy Lat. p. 30. 1 Long p. 46. 22

Friday 30 first part light Gale from the S. W. and pleasant weather made and latter part strong light and variable strong to East and saw a big strong to the North and East Lat. p. 35. 48 Long 37. 55

Saturday 31 first part light breeze from N. E. and heavy weather at 4 P. M. wind shifted to the N. W. middle part strong wind at 7 A. M. wind shifted to the East. Minuted top Gale sails and hoisted up the top sails later part mild and weather much the same Lat. p. 35. 12 Long p. 46. 28. 46

Sunday 1 of April first part strong wind from N. E. and freshening at 7 P. M. took in the top and main dunt at 8 close up the top sails at 11 furled the fore and M. top sails at 11 took in the fore sail later part mild weathering at 11 set fore and M. top sails and fore sail so easy Lat. p. 35. 12 Long p. 46. 28. 5

Monday 2 first part light air from the North at 8 made sail light wind from the N. W. though the night strong by the wind up to N. E. at 9 A. M. wind veered to the West set the top mast standing sail strong North Lat. p. 37. 34 Long p. 46. 27. 10

Tuesday 3 first part light wind from the S. W. and clear saw a bark in the S. W. coming up for us at 6 A. M. a light breeze sprang up from the N. E. strong by the wind the bark gaining on us saw a schooner in the West sent out the ship's boat Lat. p. 36. 50 Long p. 46. 28. 55
