Wednesday 4 first part light breeze from the SE and calms from the French Bark us along from Calpe and bound to Spain middle part latter part light breeze from NE turning upon a wind to the NW
Lat. 10. 32. Long. 10. 36

Thursday 5 first part light breeze from the NE and pleasant turning upon a wind to the NNE middle part latter part light breeze from NW turning to the NNE saw a Ship sailing to the southward Lat. 10. 43.

Friday 6. There 24 hours light variable winds and calms covered North set changing sails took them in N. E. Lat. 10. 55

Saturday 7. Commencing with calms at 4 P.M. a light breeze sprang up from the NE by 10 middle part wind from ESE and clear latter part wind veering to the North turning upon a wind to the NW Lat. 10. 50. Long. 10. 46

Sunday 8. first part moderate winds from the NE by N and clear middle part wind from NE by E at day light tacked to the Eastward at midday again to the NNE wind and was for much the same Lat. 10. 14

Monday 9. first part light winds from the NE and pleasant at 4 P.M. tacked ship to the Eastward at 9. tacked again to the NNE moderate breeze blowing by the wind up to NNE Lat. 10. 26 Long. 10. 56

Tuesday 10 moderate breeze from the NE and clear middle and latter part (breeze) wind from the Eastward turning upon a wind to the NE. At 1 P.M. saw the Island of Sumatra bearing ESE. For 40 miles Lat. 10. 50 Long. 10. 50

Wednesday 11 first part moderate winds from the East and clear at 7 P.M. tacked to the ESE 15 miles clear middle and latter part strong breeze turning NNE East
Lat. 10. 19. 36. Long. 10. 59. 18

Thursday 12 first part light breeze from the E and clear middle and latter part the same an heavy falling rigging saw a Ship sailing North Lat. 10. 57

Long. 10. 55

Friday 13 first part strong breeze from the East and pleasant middle part wind baffling and squally latter part the same turning N by E. At 10 hours falling ship Lat. 10. 47

Long. 10. 27

Saturday 14. Commencing with light winds from ESE and clear weather middle part and latter strong breeze veering from ESE to NE by E squally with rain turning North with the S. by E. mast and top. Late Sunday 15th at 11 saw a Ship sailing SE

Lat. 10. 12. 29 Long. 10. 31. 47

Sunday 15 first part strong breeze from the ESE and pleasant middle part squally latter part strong breeze and clear course N by E Lat. 10. 50. 8 Long. 10. 32. 18

Monday 16 Commencing with moderate winds from ESE and pleasant middle and latter part the same at 10 hours turning in the main rigging course N by E saw a Portuguese Ship sailing west S. W. Lat. 10. 53
