Saturday 12 of April 1838

first part light breeze from the westward and pleasant stirring by the wind to the north at 5 PM tack'd to the westward latter part light breeze from N.E. Course N.W. by N. the watch pointing inside

Sunday 13 first part moderate breeze from N.E. and overcast weather middle part fine and the S.E. At 4 PM set the Main & Fore Studding Sails at 5 set the Fore Topmast and lower Studding sails Course N.W.

Monday 14. first part strong Gale from E.S.E. and cloudy wind increasing at 6 took in Studding Sails Main and Fore Gale Sails down reefed the Topsails much muddier part wind and weather much the same latter part strong breeze from the N.E. made sail stirring upon a mind N.W. by N.

Tuesday 15. these 24 hours strong breeze from N.E. and overcast weather stirring upon a mind to the N.W.

Wednesday 16. these 24 hours moderate Gale from N.E. and clear stirring by the wind up to N.W. saw two schooners standing to the South and a ship standing S.W.

Thursday 17. commencing with a light breeze from the N.E. and clear At 6 muddier from the S.E. set Studding Sails middle part light variable breeze latter part strong Gale S.W. course N.W. by N. saw three sail stirring to S.E.

Friday 18 of May 1838

Commencing with strong Gale from N.W. and clear stirring N.W. middle latter part stirring to cloudy weather saw two sail supposed ourselves across the Gulf Stream

Saturday 19. first light breeze from the N.W. and cloudy mind working N.W. by N. at 5 took in Top Gale and spoke the brig ship of New York bound to New York at 6 down reefed the Topsails mind from N.E. stirring upon a mind to N.W. by E. at 7 made all sail latter part saw 7 different sail across the water and over board with them

Sunday 20. first part light breeze stirring to the S.E. spoke the Brig Neptune of Bristol at 4 set Studding Sails middle part strong breeze from S.W. course N.E. closed the royal yards set the sail

Monday 21. first part breeze from the N.W. at 3 PM made Long Island bearing N.W. by E. dist 15 miles at 7 PM made Rock light 10 miles dist 11 miles dist at 8 PM shot a sail at 11 PM came to with main topsail to the mast at daylight. Rutter hunt for Ely at 10 dist made 7 PM at 7 PM came on board in 20 minutes we set Royal Top Gale sails course N.W. by N. and Top Gale Studding Sails soon after we were on Terra Firma bound to see the Gal
