First part strong breeze and pleasant at sunset took in steering sails and foremast at 10 came to the wind heading to the Eastward with the Main Topsail to the Mast. At daylight started off Mast at 5 AM made the Is. of St. bearing N N W steered S W and made the Is. of Bonaville ahead dist 30 miles. At Marian midday part of a low SM dist 12 miles
