ping meat. Midday and latter part much the
same saw a Spanish Ship steering west

from NW steering by the wind midday part
light wind and a heavy swell latter part strong

from NW and pleasant midday part the
same latter part strong breeze from NW
and a pleasant course 9 M all hands

West and pleasant course 9 M

the same wind owing to the westward latter
part strong breeze from NW steering by the
wind under double reefed topsails

Commenced with strong Gale
from NW midday part the same latter
part wind the same accompanied with
squally of wind rain steering by the wind
up to 9 by N

First part strong breeze from NW
and squally midday part much the same
pushed the main sail latter more moderate
wind steering to the NW made all sail
course 9 M

from NW 9 M and steering to South at 6 M
Ship to the westward midday part took a breeze
from N course South All AM saw a shoal
