Monday 24

Push gales from N West on the first part. Middle part wind veered to the Westward took in two Boats and the remaining sails and hauled by the wind to the S E West

First and Middle part fresh mizzen from S W by West course S by E latter part light air from the N with the studding sail S by W is the course

Wednesday 26. of December 1838.

First part gentle breeze from N N E stiring S by W mizzen part strong mizzen increasing to a gale shortened sail to a close reefed Main topsail and Moresail heading S E latter part kept off S S and made sail

Thursday 27

These 24 hours strong gales and rainy Ship laying too under close reefed Main topsails and staysails heading South

Commenced with a heavy Gale from W heading South upon short sail mizzen part the same latter part moderate made sail heading S E

Commenced with a heavy wind from S W and heavy swell Middle and latter part calm made Station Land dist 55 miles
