Monday 31. of December 1838

Commenced with a gentle breeze from N. N. West at 6 took a light breeze from S. W. rather fast strong Gale stirring by the wind to the South.

Tuesday January 1. of 1839.

Commenced with strong breeze from S. W. West comm. shortened sail midday put wind N. N. W. made sail rather fast the same heading S. by E.

Wednesday 2

Commenced with a strong breeze from N. N. West noon to the S. W. midday put variable later fast rainy wind N. N. W. heading South.

Lat. 57. 12 South

Long. 167. 32. W

Thursday 3

Commenced with a gentle breeze from S. E. midday put the same course N. N. W. rather fast strong breeze from S. West heading Southward.

Lat. 57. 31. South

Long. 167. 20 West

Friday 4

First part a strong Gale from N. N. W. and rainy shortened sail rather fast moderate made all sail course S. W. by West.

Lat. 58. 58 South

Long. 169. 59. W

Eamard Howland Master 1839

Saturday 5. of January 1839

First part variable misty, mings and rainy midday and rather light air and calm saw a ship bearing E. by S.

Lat. 57. 47. South

Long. 169. 58 West.

Sunday 6

Commenced with light air from N. West course S. W. by South midday put wind from S. W. rather fast blowing a heavy Gale from S. W. stirring it under short sail.

Long. 169. 58 West

Lat. 57. 15

Monday 7

Commenced with a strong Gale from South West at 4 P. M. made sail rather fast pleasant but rough all sail set. stirring N. N. W.

Lat. 56. 11 South

Long. 169. 42 West

Tuesday 8

Commenced with gentle breeze from N. N. W. and pleasant all sail set stirring by the wind rather fast gentle breeze from N. N. W. and thick heading S. W. by S.

Lat. 55. 47. S

Wednesday 9

Commenced with gentle breeze from N. W. and thick weather course S. W. all sail set midday put the sail shortened sail rather fast light air all sail course S. W.
