

Ship Robt Edmaray on the Coast of Chile

Saturday 19. of January 1857 -

First part of the 24 hours light
breeze from the NW and then moderate part wind
increasing latter part strong wind so during the
24 hours

Lat $37^{\circ} 40'$ South

Long $76^{\circ} 31'$ West

Sunday 20

First part strong Gale from the West
wind stirring the night wind which is NE by N
NE - N by E at sunset & continued fair moderate
part blowing heavy from the NW West and then
latter part stirring NE by N & N by North so evening

Lat $37^{\circ} 08'$

Long $75^{\circ} 58'$

Monday 21.

First part strong Gale from the
SW by S stirring NE by West saw a ship in NE
West stirring to the east upon a mist also a Brig
stirring East moderate and latter part blowing
heavy from the S by E so evening

Lat $33^{\circ} 56'$

Long $76^{\circ} 42'$

Tuesday 22

These 24 hours light more moderate
stirring NE by West at sundown came to
with the Moon (Yopai) to the mast the distance
of Quimpernam and No bearing NW by N
and 30 miles weather so thick could not arise
in it at daylight (saw) for a while the land
bearing NE distant 25 miles at 9 AM one boat
went on a fishing excursion the ship lying off
and on so during the 24 hours -
