

Ship Robt Canby bound into

Wednesday 30 of Jan 1839.

These 24 hours commencing with calm weather steering S West painting ships mast & masts & hull for painting masts part light air steering S West rather part painting ship so easy Lat $33^{\circ} 33'$ South

Long by Chron $82^{\circ} 20'$ West

Thursday 31 first part light air from SSW steering on a mind to the SE at 2 PM saw a sperm whale towards the boat but we not get him. Whales gone so long we could not get him. 1 hour and 5 min at a time at sunset boat came on board shortened sail steering westerly upon a mind at 2 AM came to with the main topsail to the mast breaking out between decks and stowing our stores.

Friday 1 of February 1839.

First part light air from the ESE and cloudy at 2 hours 40 min saw a school of sperm whales. Lowered and took one to the boat a hungry whale he took a large part. took the boat in his mouth and held her as much as 4 feet above the surface of the water. Aup threw us all into the air. made part lying by the whale rather part cut him in some rainy & so easy.

Saturday 2nd of February 1839.

First part these 24 hours pleasant weather light wind and boiling saw hump back steering to the East at 4 PM supported the mind to the South made part calm rather part more ship to the Westward at West

Sunday 3

First part these 24 hours light wind and rain equally boiling more ship to the South made part finished boiling rather part washed off so easy these 24 hours

Monday 4

These 24 hours commenced with strong wind from ENE steering S upon a mind at sunrise more ship to the North rather part strong wind from East ESE steering upon a mind with the main brace forward

Tuesday 5th

First part strong wind from ESE and pleasant a Sloop of War in sight with 13 stripes at her mast at sunset shortened sail steering E by N upon a mind made part strong sail at 8 AM saw a ship to the Eastward Massachusetts in sight so easy these 24 hours
