Friday 31. of 5 mo 1839

Commenced with strong wind and pleasant to the sea along side spoke the Aulay Clark Thoma of New Port 18 mo 12 in 66. 1 miach part lay by the whale cut him in so easy

boiling spoke the Hector at Norton of New Bedford 12 mo 11 in 11. At 5 PM saw whaling rowers without success stowing Southward upon a mind at 1 PM attacked to the NE the Hector on our weather quarter tagging after so easy three 24 hours

First part of these 24 hours fine weather light trading boiling at 4 PM spoke the Hector miach part cooled down rather part two ships in sight was hit the Coopers & Co

Monday 3

First part of these 24 hours fine weather and light trading stowing NE upon a mind Ship Hector in sight ahead miach part backed to the South rather part backed to the NE all hands employed men doing daily the rest 3 weeks we have got 3 large whales and had 1 watch below to the L. Boat crew (rather part stowing down wind in the main Hatch way on the Starboard side)

Monday 4 of 6 mo 1839

First part of these 24 hours fresh trading and clear but wind old fore sail backed to the South upon a mind rather part stowing Oil in the No 4 on the Lapboard side saw him back so easy

First part fresh trading stowing Oil our ship in sight at 6 PM backed to the NE miach part the same rather part tack to the South Ship still in sight fine stowing Off made sail tack to the NE so easy

First part of these 24 hours washed off to miach part up sail sailing rather part made sail mending sails all hands employed on an Irish watch all hands by day and every body by night has been so for 23 days past

First part of these 24 hours strong trading and clear weather our ship in sight mending sails an Irish watch miach part backed to the South and this morning had Butter for breakfast. Butter & meat! Butter and meat. Gad Gad that wont do. for supper no butter. Gad Gad this will do rather part mending sails to morrow Chicken food for dinner. Chicken trading up to a dough dish. On Boat Stewer got ashore below in his match below upon a table circumstance soon joins a the Irish watch at the request of
