Monday 3. of Sept 1889

First part strong Gale from N
and a Misty weather at 1 P.M. wind veered to S.W.
and rainy mist part wind at West by North
at daylight veered to S.E. Course East so easy
wind light and rainy weather

Commenced with light wind from
S East and rainy at 9 P.M. wind veered to S.W.
set the Studding sail middle and later part the
same Course E by South so easy

Wednesday 4

First part light wind from S.W.
and a pleasant at 3 P.M. wind veered to the Eastward
and gradually increasing mist and later part

E & E and cloudy a heavy swell from S.W. stirring by
