Sunday 15 of Sept 1889

First part strong light air from
E & E and clear with a sun from 10
made first the weather thick and squally
raining to latter part strong winds from S
blowing E & N. Boiling

Monday 16

Commencing with strong wind
from SE and muggy weather passing to the
E & N & under close reefed. Main & Mizen Topsails
and Foresail made first the same employed
boiling

Tuesday 17

First part moderate winds and
clear at 6 PM wind came to the S by E & back to
to the E by S at 12 Midnight finished boiling
made and latter part wind and weather much
employed stowing oil between deck saw Gun
Back &c

Wednesday 18

First part light winds from
South and clear all hands stowing oil
made first the same latter part light winds
from N & N stowing E & E.

Commencing with light winds
from N & N stowing E & E. with all sail set
storing sails below and aloft all hands employed
clearing away Micaah who later part the same
employed at Sunday jobs

Friday 20

Commencing with light winds from
West & West and clear course E & E at 3 PM wind
veered to the S & N in the harbour stowing sails
made first winds light latter part strong "Gales"
course E & E employed at Sunday jobs latter part
mashed off &c

Long by Chy 75.00 West

Saturday 21

Commencing with strong Gales from S.
E by S course East made and latter part much
the same stowing E by S with all sail set at 10 AM
made the land ahead at Meridian spoke the
angle George, Jewster of Pomington 10 m out
with 600 lbs of sugar from Malacca with Jarner
able news from Mrs W. & Child
