

Ship Robt Emaras for Valcahuano

Sunday 22. of Sept 1859

First part strong gale from S.W. and cloudy starting in from the land at 9 A.M. the Island of St Marys bore N.E. by E. showing N.E. at 6 A.M. but the chains got the S anchor off the bow took in studding sails St Marys bearing S.E. by E. Conception Tapp bearing E.N.E. showing N.E. by E. at 10 A.M. came in thick and rainy Durigina bearing E.N.E. dist 6 Miles. put two reefs in the topsails and wore ship to the west wind N.W. and rainy at 3 A.M. wind veered to the S.W. wore ship and made stow a way at 5 A.M. wore ship to the east and started for the entrance of Valcahuano Harbour at 7 passed the N Point of Durigina and commenced beating up the Bay with the wind right ahead at 3 A.M. on the 23 Sea account came to anchor in 3 fathoms water found the Stanton Island Hair Haven commenced and undergoing repairs Capt I was still anchor and aspect of the crew likewise

Monday 23

These 24 hours fine weather wind S.W. setting up shoots and painting ship

Tuesday 24

These 24 hours fine weather wind S.W. finished setting up shoots and got a raft of water off containing 100 lbs and put part of it below

Wednesday 9 mo 25. 1859

These 24 hours pleasant rather light winds from North all hands employed getting off water and stowing it away as the crew got the cook on a sick bed

Thursday 26

Light air from S.W. and pleasant the S.W. watch on liberty

Friday 27

Light air and pleasant wind from the S.W. S.W. watch on liberty sold 251 ft of Fine Cordage 2/60 p. M.

Saturday 28

Moderate Gale from S.W. the S.W. watch on liberty at 4 A.M. arrived a Chilean Brig (and) from Valparaiso and an English Brig called the Vittoria formally the three masted schooner (and) Floggia Yankee.

Sunday 29

Light Gale from S.W. and clear S.W. watch on liberty

Monday 30

Strong Gale from S.W. and pleasant got off the land rather fair S.W. watch on liberty
