

Ship *Scott Canara* off Massapequa

Tuesday 1 of Oct 1839

Fresh gales from S West and clear the S Watch on Saturday after 12 o'clock

Wednesday 2

Light winds from S W and clear the S Watch on Saturday after 12 o'clock

Thursday 3

First part light wind from North and heavy the S Watch after 12 o'clock latter part pleasant

Friday 4 These 12 hours sea &c commencing at midnight clear with light winds from S W all ready for sea at 10 AM Capt and Wife came aboard at 11 got underway and stood out for sea at 12 o'clock

Saturday 5

First part light air from S W died away calm at 3 PM came to anchor in 13/4 of water midway between Quiriquina bearing North West 3 miles our boat went on shore after lunch for the goats middle part light breeze from North at 6 AM got underway with a light wind from West at 7 the S point of Quiriquina bore West dist 7/8 mile at 10 maine still in the passage with light & clear of wind and calm.

Sunday 6

At 1 PM passed the North point of Quiriquina and took a strong breeze from S W stood N West at sunset shortened sail latter part the wind steering West

These 24 hours strong gales from S by W and squally steering to the Westward

Tuesday 8

Commenced with strong gales from the S steering N by S at 10 AM more ship to the East at daylight scarce of mist at 10 made the Island of Saufmanau at 10 miles dist bearing N by S

Wednesday 9

First part gentle breeze from S W and cloudy heading West under all sail small and latter part cloudy Massapequa bearing N N W some dist

Lat 36 48 S

Long by Chron 81 20 W

Thursday 10

These 24 hours light winds and cloudy with a heavy swell from S West middle part shortened sail latter part fine weather saw Finn Jacks

Lat 35 52 S

Long by Chron 82 10 W

Friday 11

These 24 hours strong gales from S W steering to the S W middle part shortened sail latter part fine weather saw Finn Jacks

Lat 35 58 S

Long by Chron 83 57 W

Saturday 12

First part light winds from S W steering N N W middle part calm latter part light winds from N N W steering N W under all sail employed mending the mainsail
