

Ship Port Edwards Coast of Chili off

Sunday 13 of Oct 1859

First light winds from West stirring NE saw a large sailing ship E ast at sunset shortened sail and wore ship to the South made fast thick masts and a strong wind from NW buffed by the wind to NE 30 miles

Monday 14

First fast strong winds from NW by stirring by the wind to the NE at 1 PM saw buoys to the forward saw a for then saw no more of the Miala fast more moderate stirring NW under easy sail rather fast light winds and pleasant tacked to the NE ast

Tuesday 15

First fast light air from SE and SE ast stirring by the wind to the NE making sails at 5 PM saw sperm whale two boats and chasas within 10 miles fast wind and weather much the same rather fast strong wind from N stirring by the wind to the NE 1 PM under double reefed topsails

Wednesday 16

Strong Gale from NE at 1 PM wind came to NW at 3 PM wore ship to the N spoke the large Louisa of Baltimore miala fast light breezes from NW NW kept off east for Massapeur rather fast strong Gale from NW stirring NE at 9 PM saw a shoal of sperm whale two boats and chasas within 10 miles then came on board whale going quick to menarara

Lat 34° 00 S Long 81.00 W

Thursday 17 of October 1859

Commenced with strong winds and clear at 6 PM shortened sail and wore ship to the NW miala fast squally wind south at 6 AM stood to the NE at 12 saw a large whale going to min Araraa lowsea and chasas within 1 then came on board

Friday 18

Commenced with strong breezes from NW in a cloudy morning the fit 30 miala and rather fast the same

Saturday 19

Light air from the North stirring 9 PM saw five large miala and rather fast much the same

Long by Chron 82.57

Sunday 20

Light breezes from NW by stirring by the wind to the NW at 8 AM saw a large whale lowsea and chasas within 11 then came on board

Lat by Chron 34.24 S

Long by Chron 82.00 W

Monday 21

Light breezes from NW stirring by the wind on apparent SEAS Massapeur bearing 2 NE dist 30 miles

Lat by Chron 33.56 S

Long by Chron 81.00 W
