Strong winds and pleasant under the Main Top-sail and bent another stowing upon a mind so early

Strong winds from the NE. and pleasant stowing by the mind spoke the *Moian* Coggeshall New Bedford 26^{mo} out 1100 employed mending the Main Top-sail.

Strong winds and pleasant cruising saw a ship called her the *Constitution*

Moderate trade and pleasant stowing by the mind at 7 AM saw whales going quick to mind and lowered 3 Boats in chase at 12 L Boat came up with them and got stove so was

Wednesday 29. 1^{mo} 1840

Light winds and pleasant chasing whales at 2 PM gave up the chase and came on board took in the Storm Boat and repaired her rather fast cruising by the mind

Thursday 30

Light winds and pleasant weather engaged fitting rigging and so forth at 4 PM spoke the *Cambria* Ship of New Bedford 8^{mo} out with 450 Tons

Friday 31

Light winds and pleasant saw a ship to theeward

Saturday 1. of 2^{mo} 1840

Fast 24 hour moderate trade and pleasant taring rigging and fitting ships At 8 AM saw whales going quick to mind chased until 11^{mo} came on board saw a ship cutting (sailed)

Sunday 2

Light winds and pleasant weather stowing by the mind spoke the *Canton* Ship, 550 struck a few back and Armas caught a swordfish
