Monday 28. of Sept 1840

Fresh winds from S & N stirring
to the E & E at 3 PM saw Massafuro
bearing E by N 30 my dist mid air part
stirring S.E. weather thick latter part
stirring North

Tuesday 29.

First fresh west & west winds
at 6 AM new ship to the S.E. at midnight
wind came from S.E. latter part stirring E
by North Massafuro bearing E by N 40 my.

Light winds from S.W.
and pleasant cruising by the wind

Thursday 1. of October 1840

First part light winds from
S.W. stirring S.W. at 3 PM saw whaling
going N.E. towards and took one to
the S Boat at 8 got him along
side. Mid air part by the whale latter
part cut him in heavy squally from the
S.W. so early

Howland Master 1840

Friday 2 of October 1840

Fresh winds from S and N
and at 3 PM began to boil set the fore and
Mizen topsails latter part finished boiling

Fresh S & N winds and pleasant
cruising by the wind

Light winds from S.W. and

Monday 5

First weather at 1 PM set
a Boat on shore on the N.E. side of the Island
found no inhabitants but very appearance of
these leaving left the Island took off what
they could find caught some fish mid air
part started off the the S.E. wind from S.W.
latter part hauled again and took off the
Boat started off N by N.

Tuesday 6

Strong winds from S.W. and Chy
at 6 AM the land bearing S.E. dist 6 miles saw a
school of sperm whales going quick to wind
and towards but did not catch him latter
part stirring by the wind
