

Ship Port Emaras Coast of Chili

Thursday 3 of December 1840

Light winds and fine weather at 3 PM finished cutting and began to boil so was thus 24 hours boiling
I Juan Hernandez 98 20 m

Friday 4

Light winds from S and fine weather midday and latter part laying off and on at Juan Hernandez latter part Capt and wife on shore engaged boiling at 11 returned with a fine lot of straw lamp

Saturday 5

First part calm & at two o'clock on shore to be filled with water at 5 PM water came along side took it in and stored for Matcahuano latter part boiling & course ESE
I. Hernandez 109 30 m

Sunday 6

Strong winds from SSE steering by the wind to the Eastward took in Pop Gale sails at 7 finished boiling set the Main sail latter part steering by the wind under double reefed Pop sails employed stowing Oil

Monday 7

Strong winds from S and fresh sun steering to the N PM finished stowing Oil

First and middle part light winds from SSE steering by the wind to the Eastward latter part calm
Late in Day 34. 20 P

Wednesday 9

First part calm midday and latter part light winds but standing sails and set them

Late in Day 34.50 P

Long by Chron 76. 40 M

Thursday 10

First part fresh winds at 2 PM saw whale towards the Quarter Boat and have it as the Port struck got stove and lost her whale at 4 PM saw a right whale ahead as Noonah at 5 took up the Boat and shaped our course for Matcahuano

Late in Day 36. 05 P

Friday 11

First part strong breeze from SE by E and thick weather at 5 AM took in standing sails Pop Gale sails at 11 AM double reefed the Pop sail at 2 AM more ship to the N by S at 4 rose again to the Eastward so was with strong winds and pleasant
