Monday, Oct. 12<sup>th</sup>

Winds from the N.W. ship heading S.W. saw two finbacks shortened sail at dark so ends

Tuesday, Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>

Winds strong from S.E. ship steering different courses took in sail at dark so ends saw plenty of Birds

Lat. 37.00, S.

Long. 29.34, W

Wednesday, Oct. 14<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds from S.E. ship on the Eastern Tack, N.E. plenty of birds so ends

Lat. 38.45, S.

Long. 29.10, W

Thursday, Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>

Moderate gales from the S.E. ship on different tack so ends this day

Friday, Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> strong N.E. Wind with some rain ship on different tack so ends this day

Lat. 36.38, S

Long. 29.11, W

Saturday, Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>

Strong S.E. and E. winds with thick drizzly weather latter part rain so ends

Sunday, Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>

First part thick fog and calm latter part the same so ends this day

Monday, Oct. 19<sup>th</sup>

thick fog with a light air from the N.E. ship heading S.E. so ends this day

Tuesday, Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>

Dusk with fog and rain ship heading S.E. took in sail at dark so ends this day

Strong winds from the S.E. and S. have been N. and S. E. and W. for the last few days with quite dense weather and seen nothing so ends
