light winds from the N. ship, steering different courses saw several finbacks took in sail at dark so ends

First part strong winds from the N. and N.W. With rain and fog ship on the western tack, so ends

Friday Dec. 4. 40

Light airs from the N. and N.W. took 3 blackfish saw plenty of N.W. Porpoises ship heading N.E. so ends,
