Wednesday, Jan, 6th

number of right-whales lowered
without success, Sat, 37-43, S.

Thursday, Jan, 7th

All this day light
airs, and calms, saw two right whales,
lowered without success, so ends



Sat, 37-30, S.
Sun, 18-27, W.

Friday, Jan, 8th

all this day moderate
winds from the N.E.
ship steering different courses
saw two right whales, lowered
L.B. shot a Bow lance in to one
W.B. Boat went and struck
iron, cleared, so ends, P.S. saw the
barque, Falcon, Boat, fast.
