moderate winds from
the N.W. and N. finish boiling
at 12. A.M. at 6. spoke the Bark
Falcon. boiling got 3. Whales, the
S. W. out of the same school that
I got mine. took in sail hauled
ing. M. Inaccessable isle bearing
S. S. E. dis. 20. m. so ends

Friday Feb. 12. th

Strong winds
from the N. and thick took
in the top sails and stode down
the oil, 50. lbs. in all. saw the
bark Falcon. at 2. P.M.
cleared up and wind hauled to
the N. W. wore ship and made
sail. heading N. and N. S. E.
so ends.

Saturday Feb. 13

moderate winds
from the N. W. and N. ship on
different tacks. both isles in
sight. saw an albatross with sea-
gy. stump. suppose it drifted from
S. America. Took in sail at dark
so ends

Sat, 37-10, S.

Sun, 12-3 2, N.

Ship R. Edwards
Sunday Feb. 14. st

Light winds from the
S. E. latter part set in raining
Capt. J. Lander came on board
inaccessable isle in sight bearing S. E.
dis. 4. m. so ends.

Monday Feb. 15. th

Fresh breeze from
the S. E. and S. W. ship on
eastern tack. both isles in
sight so ends.

Tuesday Feb. 16. th

all this day calm
two sail in sight. both
isles in sight. took in sail
at dark as usual. so ends this
Sat, 36-43, S

Wednesday Feb. 17.

Light winds and
clear weather. saw a large
merchant ship. spoke the
Bark Falcon. so ends.

Thursday Jan 18

Light and baffling
winds ship on different tacks. saw
two merchant ships. took in sail
at dark. so ends.
