Wednesday, Sept. 7th

Moderate winds from the S.E. steering N.W. and N. all hands employed in washing ship so ends,

Lat, 35-46.5,
Lon, 123-23.6.

Thursday, Sept. 8th

Moderate gales from the E. with rain ship on different tacks so ends,

Friday, Sept. 9th

Moderate winds from S.E. and squall up, ship heading N. shorten sail at dark so ends,

at 4 p.m. Lat 35-17.5,
Lon 122-28.6.

Saturday, Sept. 10th

First part moderate latter part fresh breezes from E.N.E. and N.E. ship on eastern tack, shorten sail at dark so ends

at 4 p.m. Lat, 35-08.5,
Lon, 123-29.6.

Sunday, 11th

Fresh breeze from E.N.E. ^{ship} on different tacks so ends

Lat 35-38.8
at 4 p.m. Lon, 124-06.

Monday, Sept. 12

Fresh breeze from N.W. with heavy squalls latter part wind N.W. ship on different tacks so ends,

Lat 25-01
at 4 p.m. Lon, 124-08

Tuesday, 13th

Moderate gales from N.W. and N. ship heading S.W. and E. Took in main top sail at 3 p.m. so ends,

Wednesday, Sept. 14th

Strong gales from S.W. and N. at 12 p.m. wind moderate made some sail more ship, and wore back again at dark so ends

at 4 p.m. Lat 35-30.5,
Lon 124-25.6.
