First part strong winds from N and N.E. for cutting and started work, latter part light winds from the N. so ends

Sat, 34-51, S.
Sun, 123-46, E.

Sunday Sept. 25. th

Moderate winds from N, N.W. and S.W. ship steering different courses, all hands employed in boiling so, ends started sail at dusk

at 3 p.m. Sat, 34-39, S.
Sun, 123-34, E.

Monday Sept. 26. th

First part moderate, latter part light winds from S, S.W. ship steering different courses, shortened sail at dusk, so, ends.

Sat, 34-23, S.

Ship Robert Edwards 1864.

Tuesday, Sept. 27. th

All this day calm all hands employed in stowing down, and washing ship, so ends

at 4 p.m. Sat, 34-06, S.
Long, 124-58, E.

Wednesday, Sept. 28. th

Moderate winds from N.W. ship on different tacks, saw three humpbacks so ends

at 4 p.m. Sat, 34-22, S.
Sun 124-56, E.

Thursday, Sept. 29. th.

Moderate winds from S.E. and calm, ship steering West, all hands employed in setting up shooks and mending sails, so ends

at 4 p.m. Sat, 34-40, S.
Sun, 124-31, E.

Friday, Sept. 30. th.

Strong winds from N.E. Ship steering different courses S.E. to be in sight so shortened sail at dusk, so, ends.

Sat, 34-36, Sun 123-50
