Schooten sail at dusk, so ends, this day

Monday, Oct. 10th

Moderate Winds from
S. ship heading different courses, all
hands employed in stowing down,
so ends.

Tuesday, Oct. 11th

Moderate winds from
S. W. ship heading E. S. E. S. S. E. part light
winds, so ends.
Lat, at 3, 34.26,
Sun, 124.58, E

Wednesday, Oct. 12th

Fresh Breezes from
N. and N. N. E. ship steering different
courses, all hands employed in
setting up, sheets, so ends,
at 4, p.m. Lat, 34-22

Thursday, Oct. 13th

Moderate and puffing
winds. Ship steering different
courses, saw several finbacks, at dusk
bore ship to the Eastward, bound off,
bent new main topsail, so ends,
at 4, p.m. Lat, 34-45, S,
Sun, 123-50, E,

Friday, Oct. 14th

Moderate gales from W.
steering S. S. E. parted fly jib
stay, so ends Lat at 4, p.m. 35-12
Sun, 126-33

Saturday, Oct. 15th

Moderate gale,
from the W. steering S. E. by E.
so ends, at 4, p.m. Lat, 36-39, S
Sun, 130.03, E.

Sunday, Oct. 16th

Strong winds from
S. W. with heavy sea, S. S. E. part
calms, steering S. E. by E.
so ends.

Monday, Oct. 17th

Light winds and
calms, new roped main top gallant
sail, ship steering S. S. E. and S. E. by
E. so ends

Tuesday, Oct. 18th

Light winds from
N. W. steering S. E. by E. so ends
