

Abstract of a Whaling Voyage in
Nov. 12th Saturday.

First part
Fresh breezes from S.E.
Sailed part from S.W. at 4 p.m.
took our anchor and put to sea
at 8 p.m. shortened sail off the
mouth of Storn Bay so ends.

Sunday Nov. 13th
Fresh breezes from
S.W. Ship steering to the east-
ward pass a whaling brig.
off Northen. isls. at dusk kept the
ship off N.E. so ends.

Monday Nov. 14th
Fresh breezes from
S.W. Steering N.W. to
day I ascertained from the parties
concerned, Namely, William Peacock,
Martin Cummings, John Boyle,
that they with two others,
Thomas, Delano, & David Harrington
not now on board Delano, being discharged
Harrington. Disputed. Took from
the ship's main board in the night
one box of Navy tobacco, and took it
on shore in small quantities and sold
it. Sailed part winds
moderate from E. steering N.E. by N.
saw a school of black fish. so ends
Lat. 41.09 S.

Tuesday, Nov. 15th
Moderate winds from
E. S.E. steering N.E. Sailed part
winds E. steering N.W. so ends

Lat. 39-45 S.
Lon. 151-59 E.

Wednesday Nov. 16th
Moderate winds from
E. steering N.W. at 4 p.m. Bent out
main top sail. so ends.

Lat. 38-37 S.
Lon. 152-00 E.

Thursday, Nov. 17th
Light air from
N.W. Lowered for black fish
took 5. at 4 p.m. more ship wind
N.W. Ship heading N.W. so ends.
Lat. 37-58 S.
Lon. 154-00 E.

Friday Nov. 18th
Strong wind from
N.W. with rain. ship steering N.W.
at 3 p.m. raised spout. more ship
saw nothing more. at 4 wind hauled
to the S.W. and blew a moderate
gale took in sail to a close reef main
top sail. so ends
Lat. 37-15 S. Lon 155-00 E.
