Tuesday Dec 27th

First part thick
fog & calm, latter part at 4 fog
lit up, made sail, saw several finback
ship on different tacks, shorten sail at
dusk, finish boiling, so ends

Wednesday Dec. 28th

Strong, easterly winds
with fog and rain saw one right
whale, ship on different tacks, all
hands employed in stowing down
so ends,

Thursday Dec. 29th

All this day thick fog
and light, easterly winds, all hands
employed in scraping down so ends,

Friday Dec. 30th
All this day thick fog,
so ends,

Sat, Dec. 31st

First part thick fog
at 12 m. lit up made all sail
winds from S. & W. ship steering
to so ends Took in sail at dark

at 2 p.m. Lat = 47 = 06.
Lon 160 25. E.

Sunday Jan. 1st

moderate winds
from S. W. / W. / S. W. at
2 p.m. saw 8 right whale
lowered, shut in thick fog
boats come on board, shorten
sail at dark

Thursday Jan. 5th

Strong winds from N.
Ship steering different
courses at dark shorten sail
so ends

Lat at 2 p.m. 47-10

Lon, 160-40

Friday Jan. 6th

Strong winds
from W. ship steering different
courses, shorten sail at dark, so ends

Lat at 4 p.m. 47-40

Lon 162-10

Sunday Jan. 7th

Moderate gales
from W. ship on different tacks
so ends

at 4 p.m. Lat 48-40. S.

Lon, 161-39. E.

Sunday Jan. 8th

Strong winds from
W. made sail at 7 a.m. latter
part winds S. W. ship on different tacks
took in sail at dark so ends Lat 37-38. S.
Lon 162-55. E.
