Settled part closed up, made sail
ship on different tacks, wind backed
N.W. at dusk shortened sail
so ends

Tuesday, Jan. 10th

Strong winds from
W. and N.W. with rain and
fog ship heading S.W. and E.
Shorten sail at dusk so ends

Sat. 47-00. S.

Sun. 161-17. E.

Wednesday, Jan. 11th

Moderate gales from
N.W. and W. heading
S.W. so ends

Thursday, Jan. 12th

Strong winds from W.
Ship on different tacks
shorten sail at dusk so ends

at 4 p.m. Sat. 49-17. S.

Sun. 159-22. E.

In Ship Robert Edwards of N.B.
Friday Jan. 13th

Light winds from
S.E. ship steering different
courses at 3 p.m. Raised right
Whale, lowered fore Boat. S.B.
stuck took the whale to the ship
at 5.2. finish cutting at 2. A.M.
so ends this day



Sat. 47-40. S.

Sun. 159-40. E.

Saturday, Jan. 14th

Light and baffling winds
Bent new main topsail made
all sail, saw plenty of finbacks
started to boil at 3 p.m. shorten
sail at dusk so ends

Sat. 47-37. S.

Sun. 159-40. E.

Sunday Jan. 15th

Moderate winds from W. N.W. & E.
W. S.W. ship steering different
courses, shorten sail at dusk
so ends

at 5 p.m. Sat. 47-36. S.

Sun. 160-36. E.

Monday Jan. 16th

Strong winds from
W. & N.W. ship on different
tacks, finished boiling at 10. A.M.
at 11. broke out to stow down, finish
at 8 p.m. and shortened sail so ends
Sat at noon, 46-51. S.
