Thursday Jan. 19. th.

Moderate gales from
W. ship heading S. by W.
so ends

Friday, Jan. 20. th

Strong winds with
heavy squalls from W. S. W. ship
on Northern tack, under two
reef top sailer, S. by W. at dark shortened
sail heading S. S. E. so ends

at 6. p. m. Lat. 47-40. S.
Lon. 160-57. E.

Saturday Jan. 21. st

Strong Winds from
W. and squally ship heading
S. S. W. S. S. S. E. shortened sail at
dark so ends

Lat 47-48. S

Sunday Jan 22. st

Strong winds from
N. N. W. ship heading W. S. S.
more ship at dark and shortened
sail heading N. W. so ends

Lat. 48-23. S

Monday, Jan. 23. st

Strong winds from
W. S. W. ship heading N. W.
at 2. p. m. left the ship off
C. S. E. and made all sail.
In the past steering E. all hands
employed in mauling bone so ends
carry sail to night

Lat at Noon 47-33. S.

Lon at 8. A. M. 158-39. E.

do at 6. p. m. 160-40. E.

Moderate gales from N. N. W.
W. with rain ship steering E. S. E.
at 6. A. M. passed a English merchant
ship heading W. with all topgallant
masts down at 6. p. m. wind fell S. W. S.
blew up so ends
