sail. Shorten sail at dark 10.00
at 6. p.m. Lat. 47-07. S

Thursday Jan. 26th

Moderate Winds from
N.W. at 5. a.m. Raised
sperm whales lowered 3 boats
Wind breezed up suddenly
to a moderate gale, boats come
on board without success, Whales
going in S.E. Solander Is. bearing
N.E. by N. 12 m. dis
20 m. Stewards Is. in sight at
8. h a.m. reefed topsails took
in fift. and headed off shore
so ends

Friday Jan. 27th

Strong winds
from S.W. steering different
courses Stewards Is. in sight
at 4. p.m. Drops S. Rock
bearing N.W. 6. dis. 12 m. so ends
so ends

Lat at 4. p.m. 47-43. S.

First part light
winds from E.N.E. Latter part
strong winds from N.W. ship

N.W. ship on different tracks saw
a merchant ship heading to the
E. at dark shorten sail so ends
at 4. p.m. Lat. 48-4. S

Light baffling winds
and calms saw two Chilean
merchant ships steering E. Saw
in sight so ends.
