

Abstract of a Whaling Voyage on board

Saturday Feb. 13. 1865

Moderate winds from N.W. ship steering different courses, saw a gam of finbacks, sent down the main top sail and put in another set of reef points. at dark shorten sail, so, ends this day. P.S. have bin. 6. as far as Bounty, Is. looking for right whales without success, have had good weather this last week, saw plenty of gonies,

at 5. p.m. Sat. 45-30, cs.
Sun. 173-15. 6.

Sunday Feb. 14. 1865

Light winds from E. ship, steering different courses, passed over some very green. 8. apparently muddy water, some few tide rips at dark shorten sail. So, ends

at 4. p.m. Sat. 44-45, cs.
Sun. 174-41. 6.

Monday Feb. 15. 1865

Moderate winds from E. 8. S.E. with thick fog and rain. ship, N.W. 6. 11. 6. shortening sail at 6. p.m. so, ends

Ship Robert Edwards, of N.B. 1865

Tuesday Feb. 21. 1865

Moderate winds from N.W. 6. with thick fog and rain. Latter part wind S. strong, two reefed the topsails, ship on different tacks. So, ends.

Wednesday Feb. 22. 1865

Light winds from S. with thick fog at times, sighted banks, permission. Latter part rain, ship on different tacks, at dark shorten sail ship heading E. so, ends.

Thursday Feb. 23. 1865

Moderate gales from S.W. ship on different tacks, close reef main top sail, so, ends

Friday Feb. 24. 1865

First part strong winds from S. ship heading E. S.E. at 12. h. wore ship, heading N.W. at 2. p.m. wind died out. Set bare topsails, land in sight, so, ends.

Sun. 174-26. 6
