

Abstract of A Whaling Voyage in
Wednesday Mar. 15th

Moderate winds from N.E. at 1. A.M. Raised a Right Whale going quick to Wind. Lowered 3 boats without success took the boats up, left the ship off S. by E. wind increasing at 3. Took in light sails and main sail & raised two Right whales going quick to windward. Two reefed the top sails so. ends, ship by the wind took in sail at dusk so ends



Sat at 12. M. 45=17.5

Thursday, Mar. 16th

Moderate winds from the S.W. at 9 A.M. saw a Right Whale going quick to windward. Ship steering different courses, at dusk shorten sail so ends

Sat. 45=14. S.

Sun. 173=17.6.

Friday, Mar. 17th

Moderate winds from the E.S.E. at 11 A.M. saw a Right Whale. Lowered three boats. S.B. struck W.B. second boat at 11. Took him to ship commenced cutting line at 4. P. so ends

Saturday Mar. 18th

strong winds from N. ship steering different courses latter part wind moderated at dusk shorten sail at 8 P.M. wind came in strong S.W. close reefed the main topsail, so ends all hands employed in baying. Sat. 45=35.5

Sunday, Mar. 19th

Moderate winds from N. ship on different tacks at 4 P.M. wind came in strong & sudden from S.W. shorten sail steering N. finished bailing so ends.

Monday, Mar. 20th

Moderate winds from S. ship steering different courses all hands employed in stowing down finish at dusk, saw a shal. so ends

Sat. 44=45.8

Sun. 172=30

Tuesday Mar. 21st

Moderate winds from S. & S.E. ship heading different courses all hands employed in scraping Bone, saw several finbacks. Took in sail at dusk so ends Sat 45=05.5 Sat 173=10
